I have interviewed many, many families in this situation over the years. And in many ways, this seems like a fate worse than death to be trapped in your body like this. But, almost always, people seem to find some comfort in finding a part of that person is still there that they thought was gone. And certainly, most families treat this as welcome news.

* vegetative state: when a person is awake but shows no sign of awareness because they are unable to respond to external stimuli in any meaningful way
