- **6.** Literature is often about characters who are different in some way from their fellow human beings. Why do you think this is?
- 7. Compare the ways in which some of the authors you have studied make social criticisms.
- 8. Show how writers can make the physical world become symbolic. Which of the writers you studied does this most effectively? Give your reasons.
- **9.** "The pen is mightier than the sword." What evidence did you find in your study of literary text and/or topic options that the written word is more effective than the use of force?
- **10.** Is it possible to free ourselves from prejudice? Discuss with reference to the literary texts and/or the topic options you have studied.
