[BOTH parts are necessary for the award of the mark. Accept other wording with the same meaning.]

TEXT D — DIFFERENCES BETWEEN MEN AND WOMEN DRIVERS

Communicative purpose:

Factual description

Message:

The aim of this task is to communicate useful advice to young women learner-drivers. The response should concentrate on women drivers; if men drivers are mentioned, it should only be by way of contrast. It should avoid completely any personal opinions or prejudices.

Verbatim copying of details from the text is acceptable provided that the details are “used”, that is, sensibly incorporated into the response. Copying details **without** so using them constitutes “undue copying”.

The candidate should include some of the following details in the guidelines.

- problems with roundabouts
- bumping into things in car parks
- hitting their car in one area while trying to avoid hitting it in another
- checking appearance in the mirror
- distraction because of children
- wearing high-heel shoes
- hitting other cars when they are close together, at lower speeds
- being easily distracted

Register and style:

The register should be fairly formal and a serious tone should be adopted.

Language accuracy is not formally assessed here and should be considered only where mistakes obscure meaning.

A reader-friendly format using bullet points or the like should be rewarded.

To achieve level 5 (adequate understanding), the candidate should include at least 4 of the details listed above.

To achieve level 9 (very good understanding), the candidate should include at least 6 of the details listed above.
