Marks will be awarded for clear presentation of **theories**, inclusion of appropriate **empirical studies** and **evaluation**. When structured questions are set (that is with parts a or b) candidates should clearly label each part of their answer a or b.

1. Describe assumptions made about human nature by the humanistic and (a) one other perspective. [25 marks] Compare the assumptions of each of the two perspectives described in (b) [25 marks] part (a). 2. Choose **two** key concepts associated with the cognitive perspective. Describe **both** and assess their effectiveness in explaining psychological phenomena. (Examples may include schema, imagery or you may choose other appropriate examples.) [50 marks] 3. Describe and evaluate the psychodynamic perspective's interpretation of one social issue. (An example could be destructive aggression but you may use a different appropriate example.) [50 marks] 4. Using examples of psychological research, describe the main procedures (a) for data collection and analysis used by psychologists working from the behavioural perspective. [25 marks] Critically discuss the use of these procedures. [25 marks] (b) 5. Select one key research study (not a theory) which you consider to be representative of **one** perspective. Describe its aims, its methodology, its findings, and the resultant (a) conclusions and implications which may be drawn. [25 marks] (b) To what extent may the research study claim to be representative of the chosen perspective? [25 marks] **6.** In what ways does a perspective of your choice link research with other

animals to human behaviour?
